From the Executive Director



Dear Member,

There's a heated discussion happening in the Lauricella household. Should we become urine donors for the pee-cycling program that recently started in our town? Both my husband Rob, and I are in the water/wastewater industry so maybe we need to walk-the-walk, as the saying goes.

The non-profit Rich Earth Institute (REI) just opened its second collection site at the Rockingham VT Recycle Center and they are looking for donors. This research and demonstration organization is sanitizing urine to create fertilizer that is used by local farmers. According to REI, "The urine we each produce in a day contains enough fertilizer to grow the wheat for a whole loaf of bread." A donor could conserve approximately 4,000 gallons of flush water each year. That's both fresh water saved, and wastewater that does not need to be treated.

With biosolids already getting composted maybe this is just the next step in reducing our human waste impact. This could become a very different way for us to manage our water world. We shall see... and I'll keep you posted.





















Scholarship Announcement

A Scholarship Program is only impactful when the funds get into the hands of student recipients. Now that we are on solid ground, Your Scholarship Committee wants to make that happen. For that reason, we are accepting applications **now** so we can help students with spring semester expenses. Please help us spread the word. The deadline for submitting a Scholarship Application is October 30st for spring semester and April 30th for fall semester.

Granite State Rural Water Association Water Environmental Science Scholarship Program

GSRWA provides training and technical assistance to water and wastewater systems throughout the state. This trade association has created a scholarship fund to provide financial assistance to GSRWA member employees and their dependents who wish to pursue a career related to the water industry.

Scholarship Amount: Two scholarships of \$1250 each are awarded each year.

Eligibility:

- Be a GSRWA member employee or a dependent of a GSRWA member employee.
- Accepted to a degree program at an accredited college or university.
- Seeking a professional career in the water or wastewater industry, or in a career that has direct relevance. Course of studies include but are not limited to environmental science, public works management, water & wastewater technology, natural resources, hydrology, and engineering.

- School transcript of grades If current or recently graduated high school or college student
- Letter of Recommendation from GSRWA member supervisor—If GSRWA member employee


